



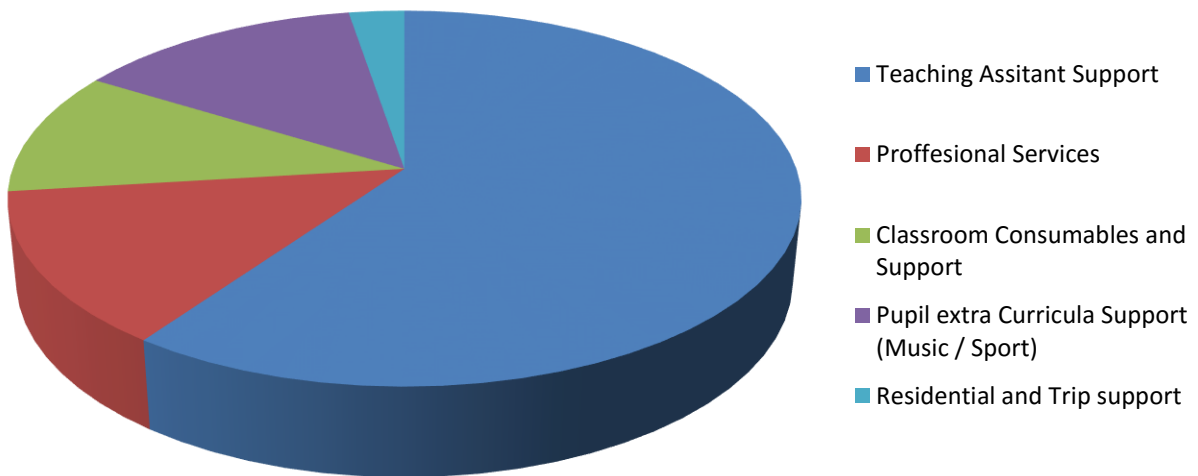

Pupil Premium 2014 /15

The school received £ 11,700 for 2014/15 academic year to support pupils who are eligible for Free School Meals. This money was allocated into the following budgetary areas: Professional Services, Staff Training, Supply Cover and Class room consumables.

The majority of the money was used to purchase specific intervention equipment and to allow staff to be released to provide interventions and attend staff development courses.
