## Sports Funding 2014 / 15

The school received £ 8,696.00 for 2014/15 academic year to support pupils.

This money was allocated into the following budgetary areas:


New whole school scheme of work REAL PE including whole teaching staff training	£ 2,495.00
Membership of Secondary School Sports Federation with all cluster schools	£ 730.00
P.E. Equipment (Curriculum resources)	£ 1,070.00
Coaching and payment of staff for sports clubs outside of school hours and lunchtime	£ 2,000.00
Support for Yr 5 residential	£ 220.00
This allows us a carry forward to 2015 /16 on sports funding of	£ 2,181.00


We have ear-marked a major some of that funding to help support a new Healthy living club which will start in September 2015. We will also re-join the SSCO group which will enable the school pupils to take part in greater cluster competitions. This will need some financial support for a Year five adventure activity residential alongside the Northamptonshire Healthy Child Initiative.

#### Results of actions this year

**Quality of PE provision:** Through six targeted staff training sessions as part of the real PE program we have seen a marked improvement in the quality and inclusiveness of our PE lessons. In all staff attended six half day sessions led by Northamptonshire Sport and the Real PE team.

**Pupil attainment and progress:** Measuring progress with the new curriculum and the new Real PE scheme has been difficult between years however progress over this year has been marked. All pupils in KS1 and KS2 have been graded against National Curriculum linked objectives through the Symphony Assessment system. The Results are as follows:

Some pupils do attend more than one club but in total we have 87 different pupils attend a club during the week or 59% of the school. This is an increase of 15% over the previous year.

**Competition:** The school has taken part in numerous sport competitions through the local cluster including football, tag rugby, indoor athletics, gymnastics and basketball. The basketball team reaching the county finals. We also run friendly sports matches against other schools in our cluster outside of the competitions. Within school the REAL PE scheme focusses on many aspects of Sport Development including Social, Personal, Cognitive and Physical but it also develops a 'Healthy competitiveness right through from early years and KS1.

**Lunchtime:** Equipment has been purchased for lunchtime activities and all the Lunchtime supervisors have taken part in an Activity training session and four session follow up by Northamptonshire sport.

Adventurous Activity: This year for the first time every child in KS2 took some part in external adventure style activities. Part funded through the ring fenced funding and with the Northampton healthy Child Initiative Support. Year Three and Four have been on a Water Experience Day building rafts, Bell boating and Paddle boarding. Year Five have taken part in a two day residential which included Rock Climbing, Trampolining, Archery, Tennis, Roller Skating and Hockey. Year Six have had a five day residential which included Mountain biking, rock climbing, Abseiling, Canoeing, Raft building, High ropes and Team building games.

**Swimming:** Every year group in KS2 takes part in a swimming sessions each year. There are strong links with an external coach in addition to the links with the Pool provider.
