How Can You Help at Home.

Reading: Every child has a reading record. Every time you read with your child, please can you sign it. Please feel free to communicate in this, as we check them daily. We suggest that every child gets to read with an adult at home everyday and encourage that some of these sessions can include an adult reading to the child.

Spelling: The expectation for the attainment of children in Year 2 has grown massively. In writing, children are expected to spell high frequency words/ common exception words (words we can't use our sounds to spell) correctly. At the front of their homework book is a list of all the words they should be spelling correctly in their independent writing. We will be sending home lists with a range of these spellings on for them to practise ready for their weekly and half termly tests.

Phonics: The phonics sounds and spelling strategies that we have learnt each week will be displayed on the children's homework. Like the spelling, it is important for these to be practised regularly and revisited. The children will take the Year One Phonics screening (that they should have taken in June) after Autumn Half Term. **Maths:** Numbots is an online website that allows your child to practise maths skills and improve their recall of number facts. Your child has been given a password and username so that they can access the site. Please encourage your child to use the site at least ten minutes every day to earn extra house points and the chance to earn Learner of the Week in Friday's Achievement Assembly. Maths facts: Instant recall facts help enormously with mental agility within Maths lessons. When children move onto written calculations, knowing these facts can be very beneficial. Each child will be sent home the EYFS and Year 1 facts which can continue to be practiced at home.
