How Can You Help at Home?

Reading: Every child has a reading record. Every time you read with your child, please can you sign it. It is important that your child reads to you and that you read to your child, as well as your child reading independently — all of these activities can be recorded in the reading record and I love reading your comments in these each day.

Spelling: In order for children to store spelling learning in their long term memory, it is important that they over-learn their spellings. So even if your child seems to have grasped their spelling for the week, please continue to spend a few minutes each day on these to ensure that they are not forgotten a few weeks later.

Maths: Times Tables Rockstars is an online website that allows your child to practise their times tables in a fun way. Your child has been given a password and username so that they can access the site. Please encourage your child to use the site at least ten minutes every day to secure this learning as it is absolutely crucial for their mathematical development. If your child has forgotten their password, please speak to their class teacher.

Maths facts: Each week we will focus on a different mathematical fact. Spend the week learning this really well (instant recall).

Homework will go out on a Wednesday and sent in on a Tuesday. Please support your child in finding a quiet area for them to work and please just ask if we can help with anything (before the Tuesday please).

Most of our homework is designed to be carried out in short, sharp chunks daily, rather than in one large chunk. This is more effective for supporting learning and can be done whilst other tasks are taking place, for example, on the walk to school, over breakfast, in the car etc.
