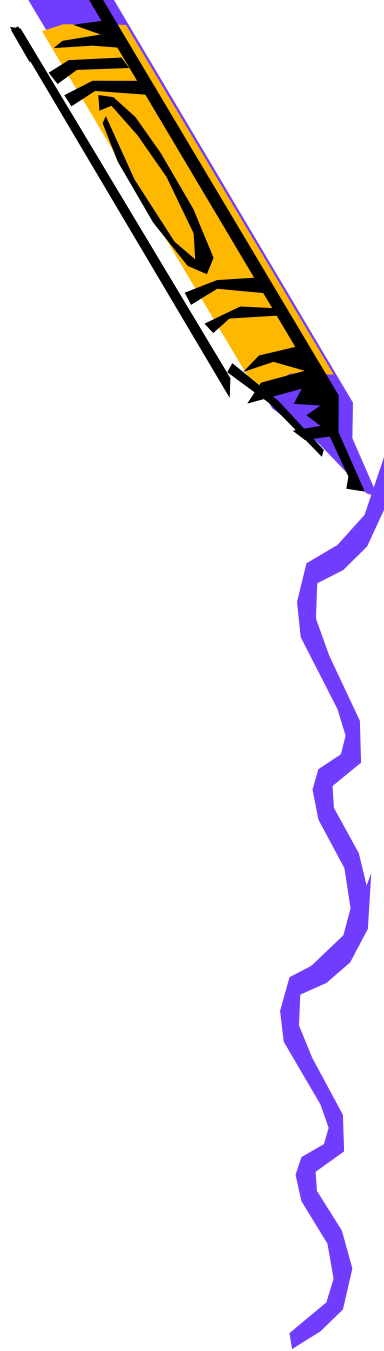

- now you say a sound can your grown up find it.



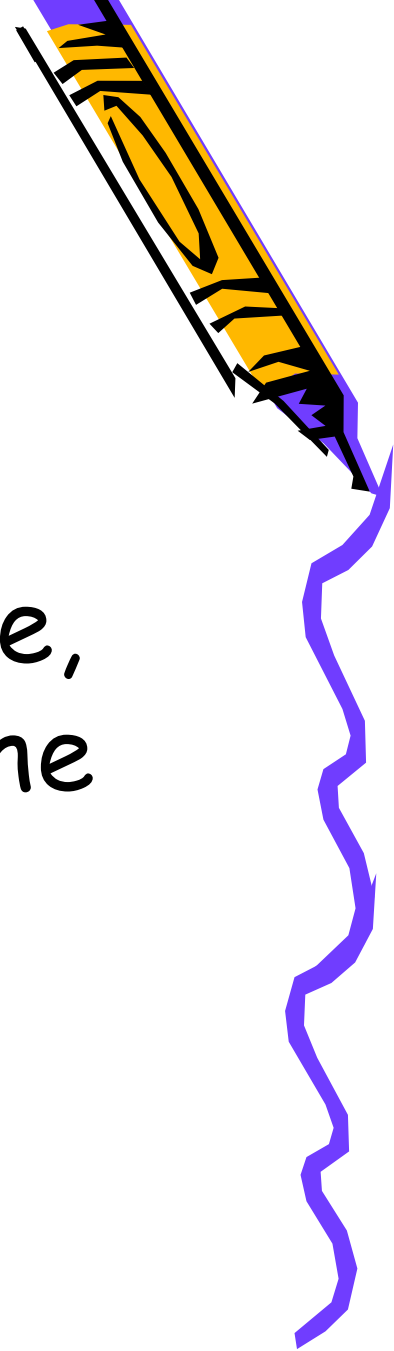
