

What is it?

Temperature tells us how hot or cold something is.

Temperature is measured in degrees

· The symbol for degrees is

• 100° = 100 degrees

 The scale we measure temperature in is called 'Celsius' or 'Centigrade'

• It was named after the scientist who developed it.

• 23°c = 23 degrees celsius
