
Learning Objective:

Use the sound mat on the next slide to practise the sounds that you have already learnt.


Play 'fastest finger' - ask your grown-up to say a sound can you point to it. - now you say a sound can your grown up find it.









- ew is a phoneme and vowel digraph.
- e and w join together to make ew.
- Makes the same sound as ue and oo (yoo).

The 'ew' is normally at the end of the words blew Screw grew flew threw stew new drew few brew But there are always exceptions chewy
