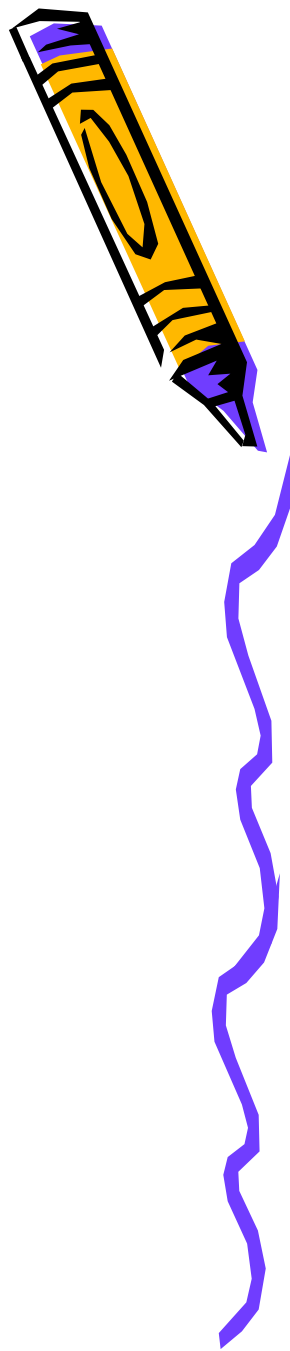

Can I say, write and read the digraph 'ew'.



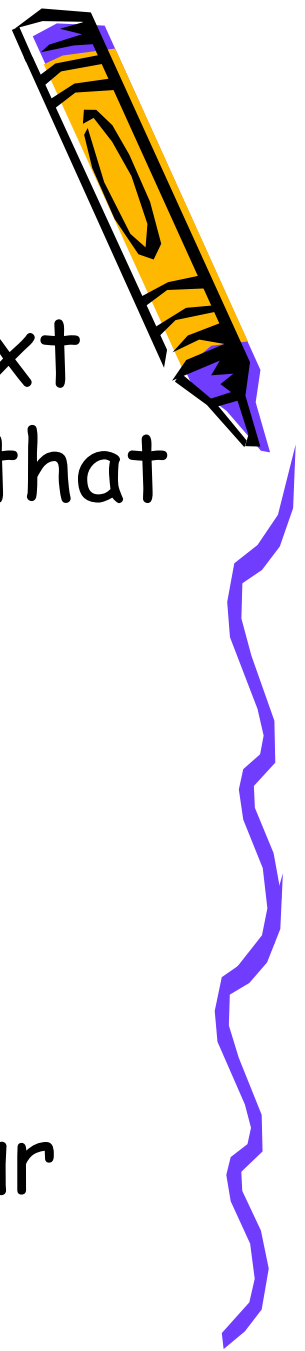

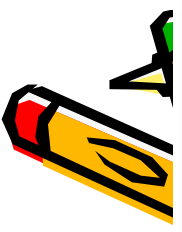

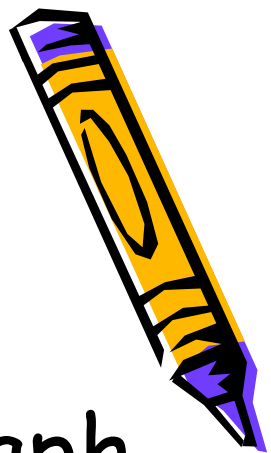

Teach:

ew

- **ew** is a phoneme and vowel digraph.
- **e** and **w** join together to make **ew**.
- Makes the same sound as **ue** and **oo** (yoo).

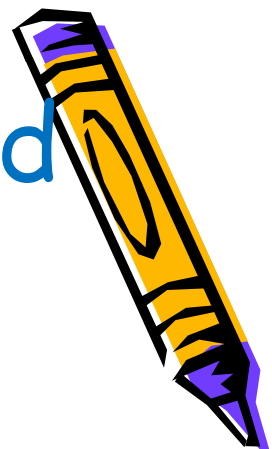

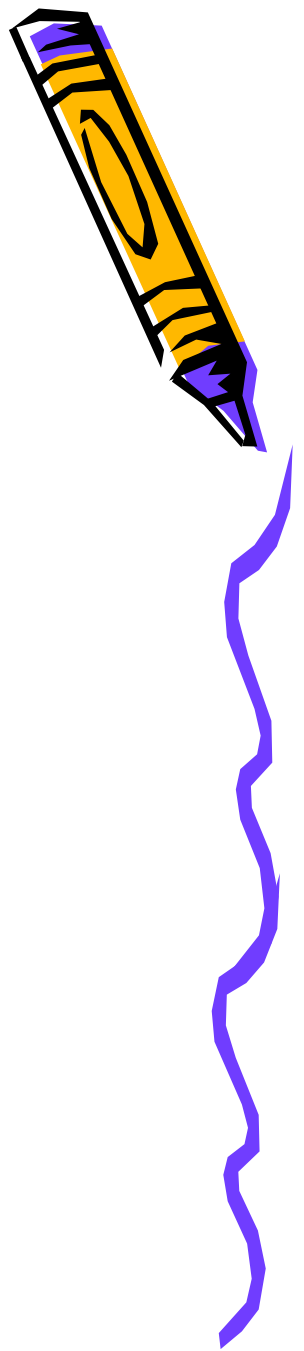
