


BOOK TALK

4) What impression do we (and Maia) get of the Carters from this extract? That they aren't very bothered about Maia, as they left her there for over an hour!

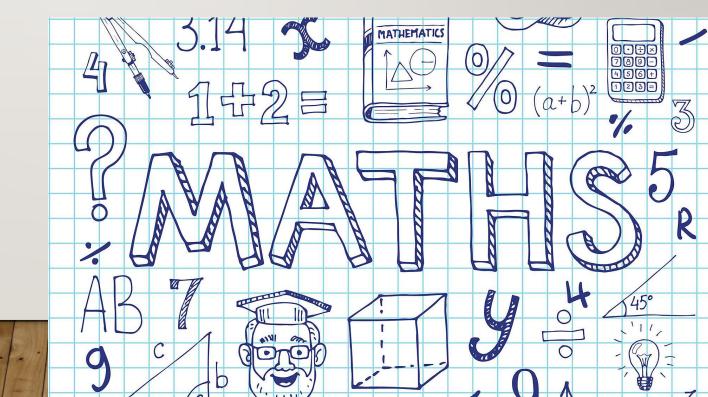


really do is think about the Deep Thought.'
