

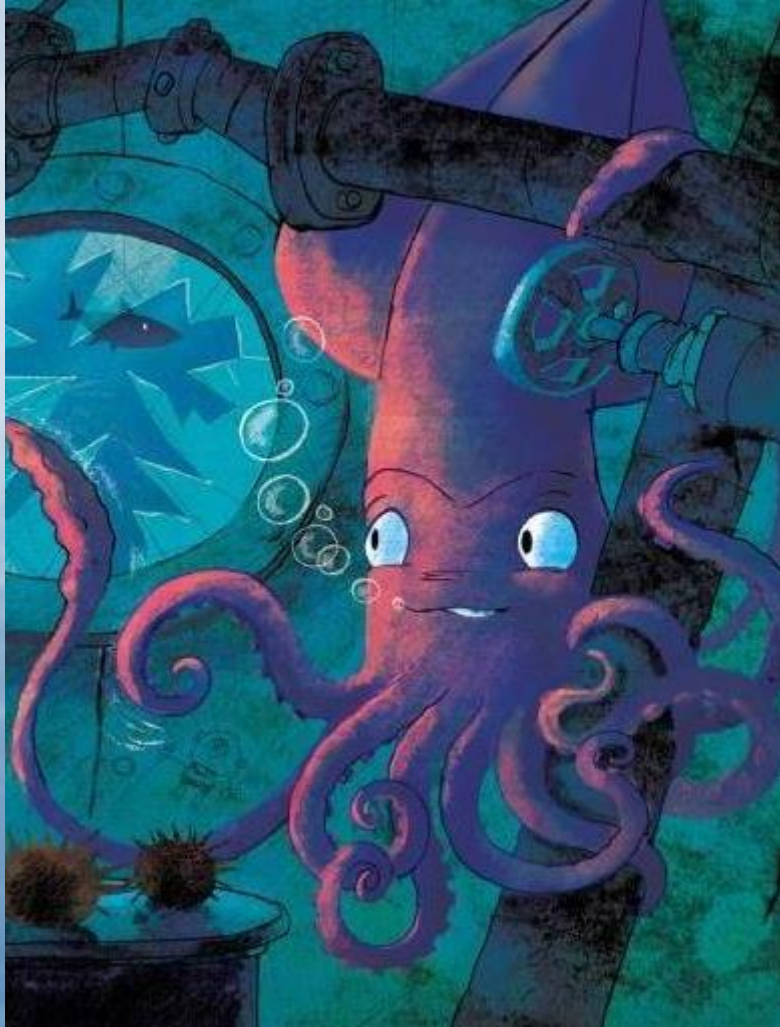

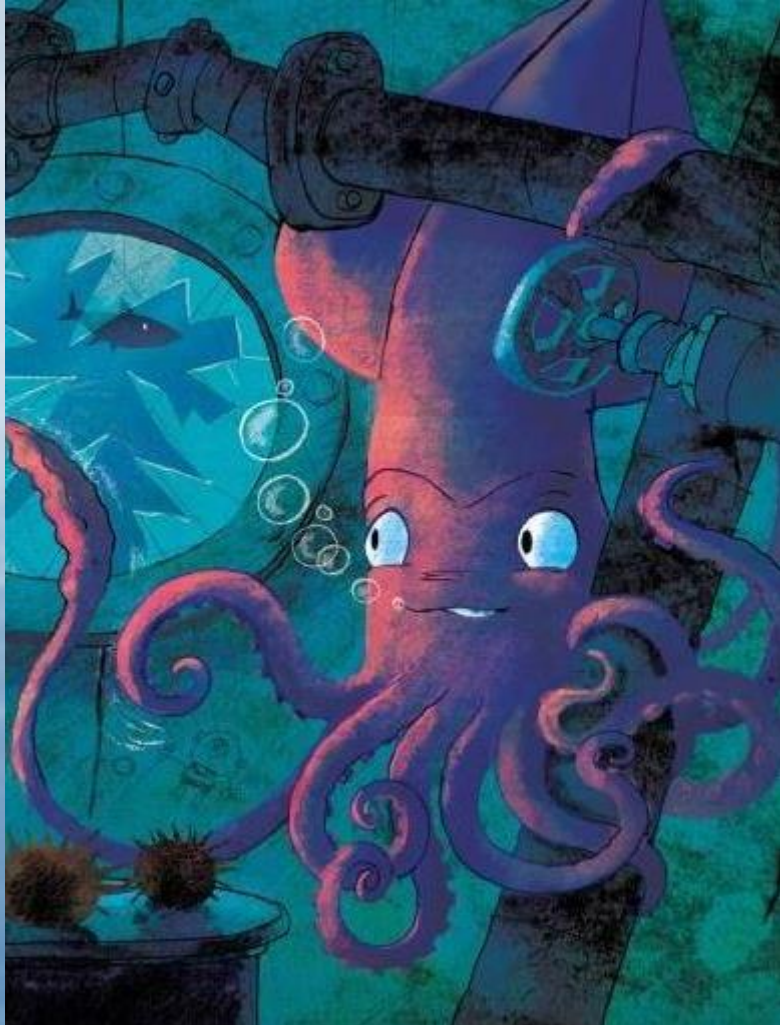
- Use the pictures and sentences to generate ideas verbally (or adult can note down ideas)
