

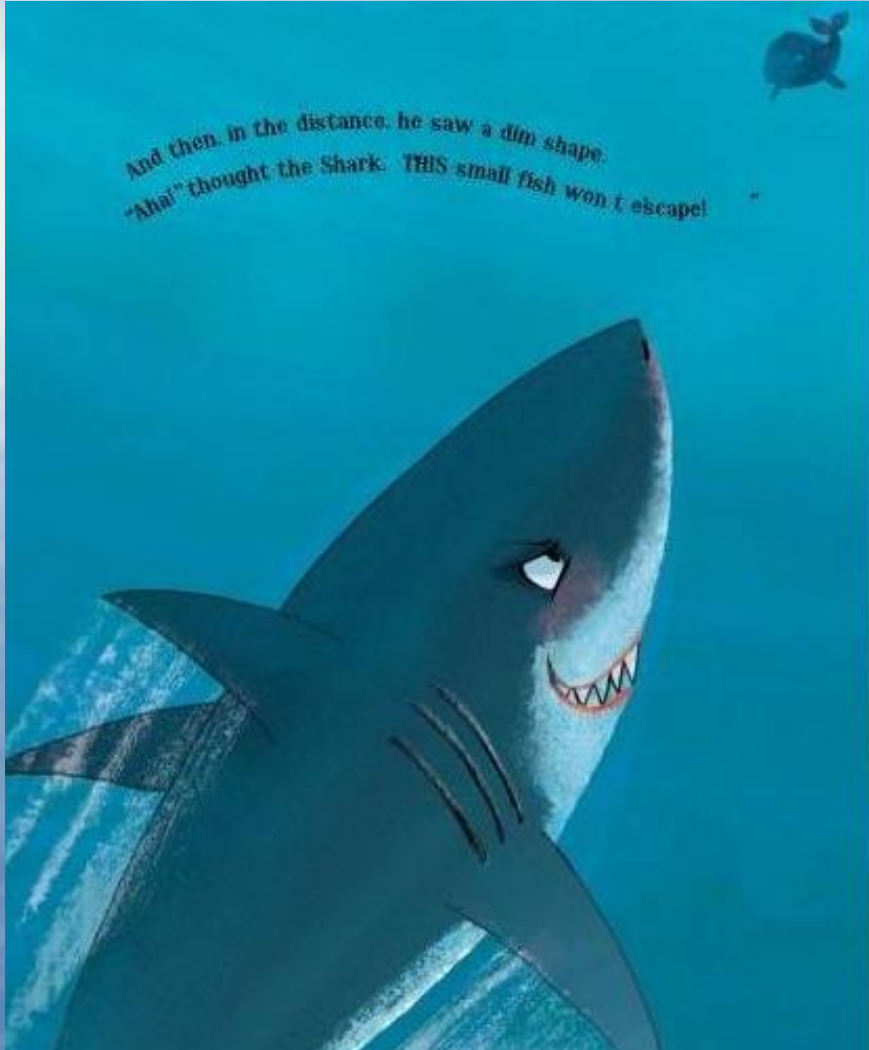

L.O – Can I write use adjectives in my sentences?

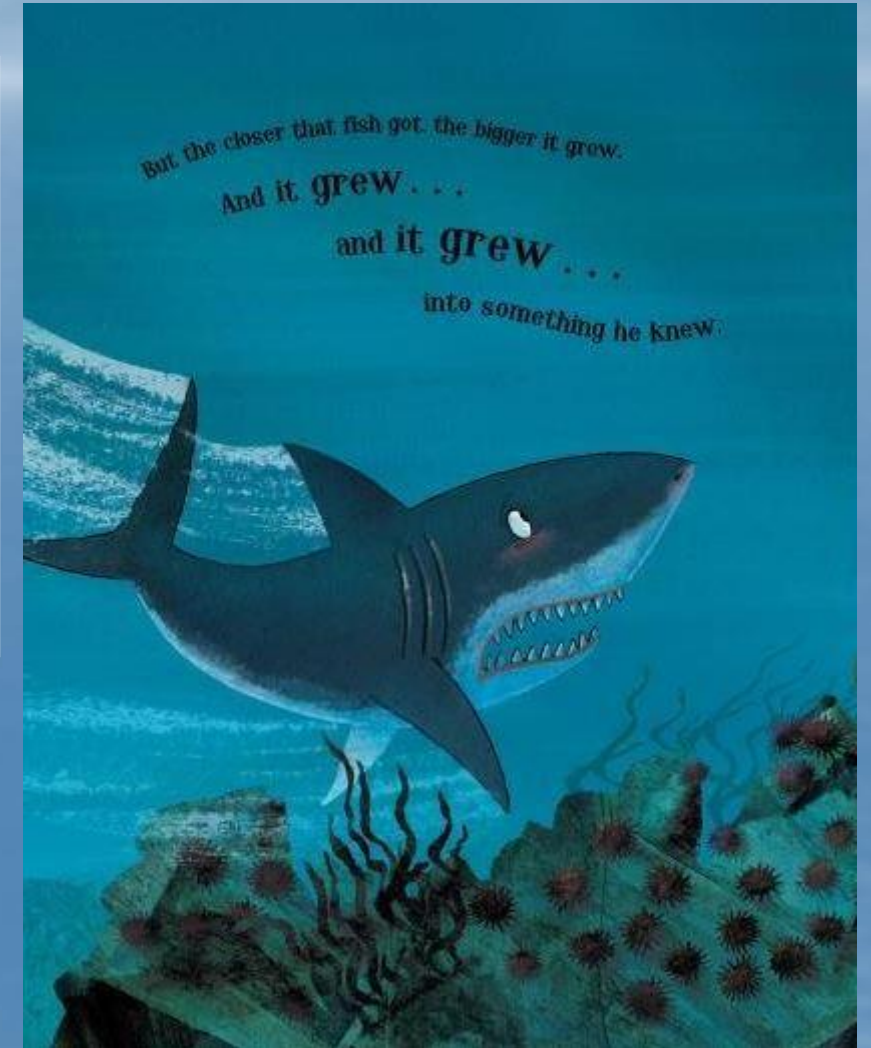
- Use the pictures and sentences to generate ideas verbally (or adult can note down ideas)

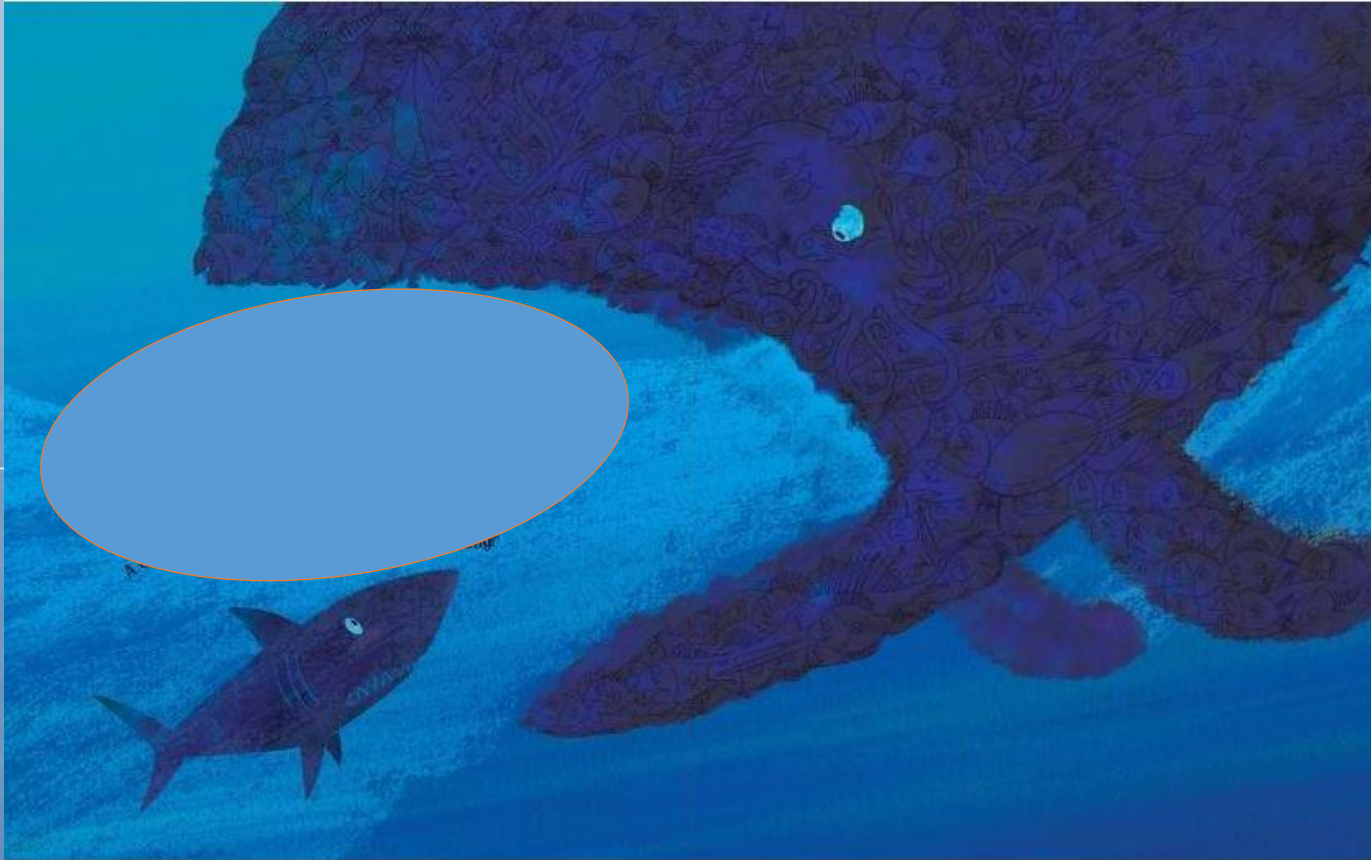
“Hey shark!” said the whale.
