# HOW WAS TITANIC BUILT?

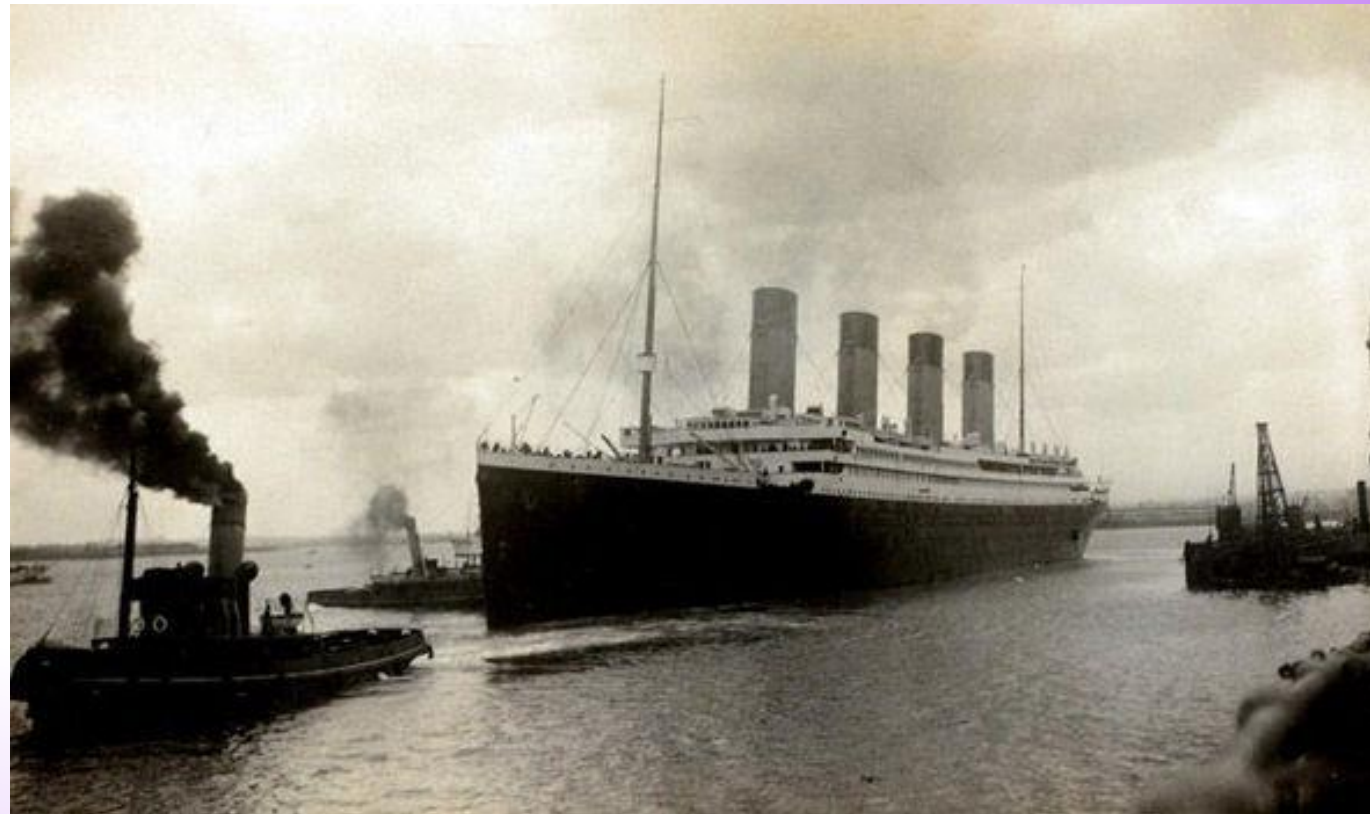
This is one way of taking notes, but you don't need to use a table. You choose how you want to organise the information best.

Key words/phrases	Detail
- Early 1900s/Belfast in Northern Ireland	Ship built
- Harland & Wolf	Famous company for building ships
- White Star Company	Asked Harland & Wolf to build 3 new ships These were to sail around the world One of these ships was the Titanic
- 15,000 workers	Architects designed boat in offices Ship yard workers had terrible conditions (hot/noisy/dangerous) There were: riveters, welders, carpenters, painters...
- Huge/high	Largest passenger ship of the time.
- May 1911	100,000 cheered launch.

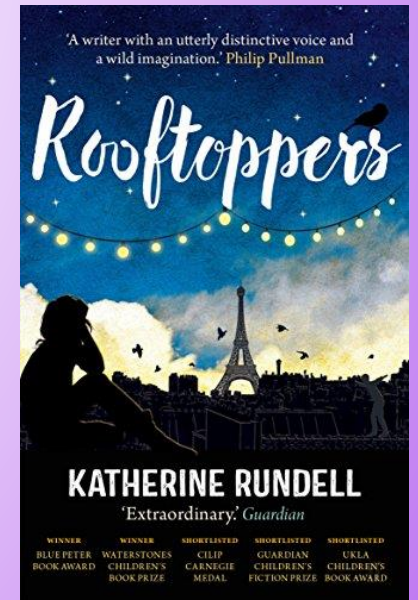
### Miss Holland's Weekly Recommendation:
