


Read the pages from the story and then discuss the questions.

I think we ought to go and take a look.


You'll find every sort of creature

Swimming through the pages of this book.


There are dolphins, whales and penguins,

What words in this poem rhyme?





Crab

And pretend that he's a spy.


<u>Turtles</u>
